



Denver University Law Building Denver, Colorado

Denver University is proud of its internationally famous College of Law. Unfortunately students and faculty in the law program were situated in several buildings on the campus and important libraries and mock court facilities were not convenient. As part of a plan to consolidate the College of Law, the University built a dedicated Law Building with an adjoining parking garage. Paul Mack and his staff were selected by the University to design the garage in accord with rigorous campus design standards that incorporated copper, brick, and shot-sawn limestone.

University programming called for a 3-bay, 4-level stand alone structure to serve faculty, staff, and students. In addition to the garage, a 92-space visitor parking facility was programmed to be under the Law Building but connecting directly into the multi-level garage through a tunnel. Parking modules incorporated both angled stalls and 90° spaces to accommodate two-way traffic. Precast concrete was the contractor's choice for the superstructure because of its inherent durability and speed of construction. The prominent stair tower and copper-clad horizontal spandrels provide a visual link to the prominent Clock tower at the Law Building.
